Last year, the UF Small and Large Animal Hospitals saw 34,650 cases and UF PETS Ocala saw 5,576 cases. 74,624 cases were seen altogether, including field visits.

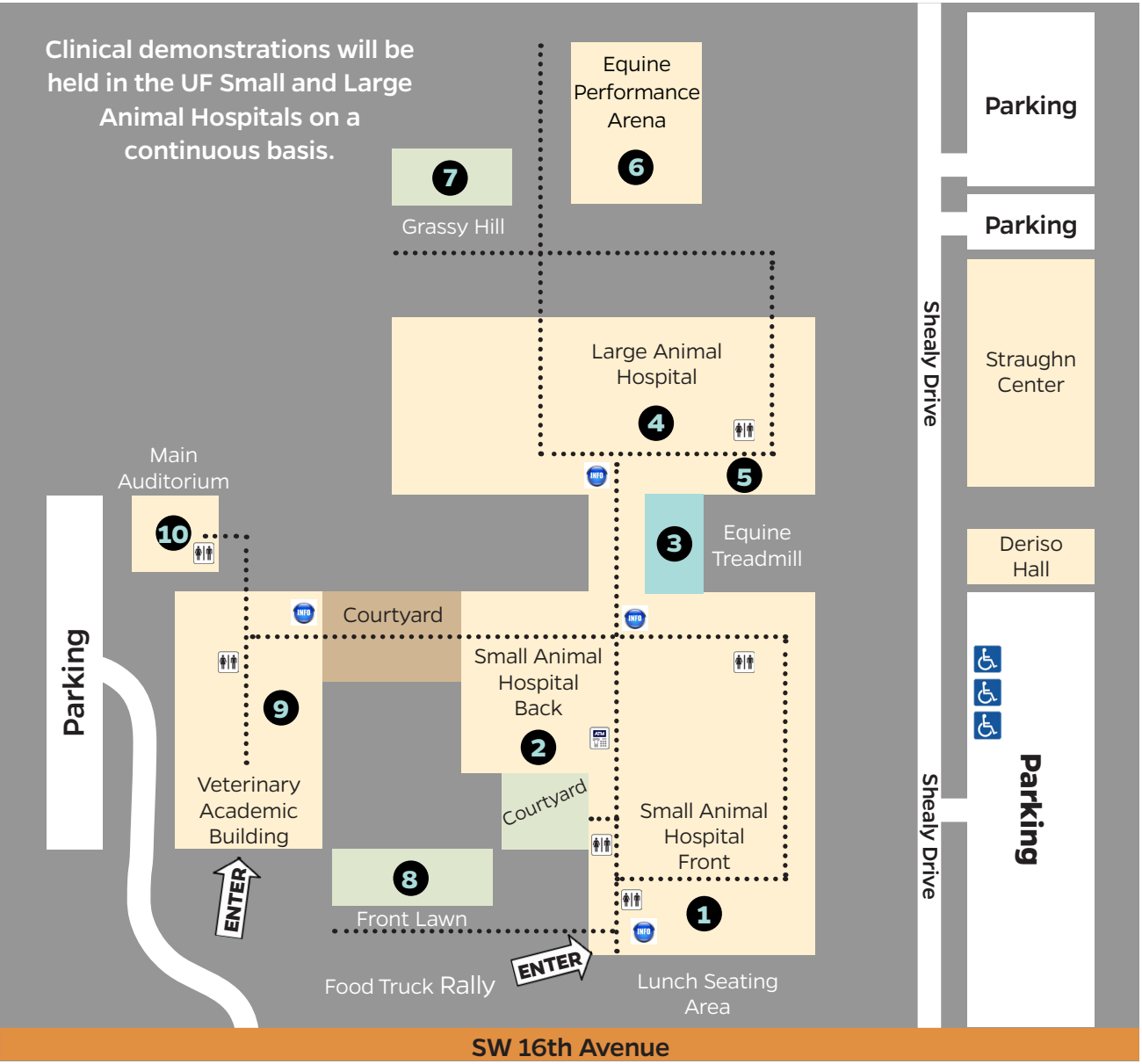

The UF Veterinary Hospitals are accredited by the American Animal Hospital Association.

The UF Small Animal Hospital is certified as a Level 1 Veterinary Emergency and Critical Care facility, the only emergency room in Florida to receive such a designation.

UF Pet Emergency Treatment Services, located in Ocala, offers after-hours emergency treatment, serving Ocala, Marion County and surrounding areas.
